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# 3 Safety instructions and cleaning

#### **Safety instructions**

- 3. Never connect the device to live wiring of more than 60VAC or 60VDC or devices with voltages greater than 60VAC or 60VDC.
- 4. Do not open the case. You cannot repair or replace any parts inside the enclosure.
- 5. Opening the housing will void the warranty!
- 6. This device is not intended to be used in residential areas and cannot ensure adequate protection of radio reception in such environments.

- 1. Red light source (M3)

  Never look directly into the red light source with the naked eye, as this may cause permanent, non-healable injuries to the eye.

This manual describes the functions of the LinkXpert series test equipment.

Please note that the presence of a function depends on the respective model.

Functions or topics that only concern LinkXpert TP are marked TP. Functions ortopics that only affect LinkXpert M3 are marked M3.

## 4.1 About LinkXpert

# 4.3 Selection of the test interface (M3)

LinkXpert M3 can be connected to copper, fiber and WLAN networks.

- To connect the device to fiber optic networks you need optional SFP modules. See also <u>specifications</u> 10
- To connect the device to WLAN networks, you need the included USB WLAN adapter.



#### Please note

- If an SFP module is plugged in, the SFP port has priority over the copper port, i.e. the device will not connect to copper networks via Ethernet.
   To test copper networks, the SFP module must be removed.
- 2. The device can be permanently connected to WLAN networks without any interference.

- Copper and fiber optic networks can also be tested with an existing WLAN connection.
- 3. The WLAN interface is always active when the WLAN module is plugged in. To deactivate the WLAN interface, the USB WLAN module must be removed.

#### Please note

- 1. Only use compatible chargers approved by Softing.
- 2. The unit must be switched on for the charging process to begin.

  After switching off the unit, the battery continues to be charged until the battery is fully charged.
- 3. After switching on the unit, the battery charge status is only displayed correctly after a few seconds.

# 4.6 Battery change



The internal battery cannot be replaced on site. Please send the device to an authorized Softing service center to replace the battery.

See also <u>Connectors and Controls</u> and <u>Selecting the Test Interface (M3)</u>. The user interface of the LinkXpert series is operated exclusively via the touch-sensitive screen (touchscreen).

The home screen is the central element of the user interface.

## 5.1 Operating concept


LinkXpert supports 2 basic approaches for testing Ethernet networks and cabling:

- 1. Autotest 25
- 2. Individual tests under Tools 27

Autotests are especially useful if the same test sequence is to be repeated often, e.g. for acceptance tests of a new network.

Single tests are particularly useful when errors are to be found in a network or when only one specific parameter is to be checked on a port, e.g. whether PoE class 8 is supported on port xy or whether the end face of a fiber optic connector is clean. (M3)

#### 5.2 Home screen



The Home screen contains all information about the most important settings of the device

- Clicking on the black bar leads directly to the system settings of the device.
- The Link LED (See <u>Device Connections</u>) shows the Ethernet connection status for copper and fiber connections (M3)
- The status bar shows the Ethernet connection status in general and the connection status to WLAN (M3)

#### • SITE

Clicking on "Site" shows the list of tests in the current directory and allows to create a new "Site" and switch between "Sites".

#### PROFILE

• Clicking PROFILE opens the "Profile" menu to change or create new profiles.

Function keys:


- 1. performs an automatic test based on the selected profile.
- 2. calls up the "Tools" menu in which individual tests can be performed and system settings can be called up.

#### **5.3 SITE**

**SITE** are directories in which tests are stored.

For example, you can create a project, a customer or an individual building as **SITE**.

Please also read Naming and counting scheme 19




The table contains all tests included in this SITE . Note: If a new SITE is created, only an empty table is shown as the table must first be filled with measurements!

#### Function keys:

- 1. Back to main screen



The table contains all "Sites" stored on the device. Note: At delivery state the device contains a "Site" default---.tst



- 1. Once deleted, "Sites" cannot be restored. All tests stored in them are irrevocably deleted!
- 2. Note that when renaming files, the file extension must NOT be changed, otherwise the changed file will NOT be listed any more, as the file filters will hide this file.
- 3. Just used "sites" cannot be deleted

#### 5.3.2 Create a new SITE



From the start screen, call up  $\underline{\text{Sites}}^{13}$  and go to  $\underline{\text{Manage}}$   $\underline{\text{Sites}}^{15}$ 

Click on function key (2) to create a new "Site".



Select a profile to use. See also <u>Profiles</u> 23

Note: You can use multiple profiles in one "site".

Click on function key (2) to continue.







## 5.4 Reports



Reports in PDF, XML or CSV format can be created directly on the device.

The reports are created via the menu SITE. see also SITE. Go to the menu SITE and select a site.

Then click to create a report

LinkXpert summarizes all tests in the SITE in this report.


The tests are stored in the internal memory. Go to Copy files to USB to 28



# 5.5 Naming and counting scheme

LinkXpert has several methods to save tests.

#### Simple Cable Label

All autotests are stored with the prefix "Link-" and an ascending number.

E.g:

Link-001

Link-002

Link-003

#### Free Form

All autotests are stored with a freely selectable prefix of the test name and an ascending number.

E.g:

Office-001

office-002

Office-003

• <%None%>"

Before each test, the user can freely assign a name for an auto test. The test is then saved with this name and an ascending number.

The ascending number is used here to safely distinguish test data.

e.g:

"Office A-001"

"Room 3-002"

"Corridor B-003"

"Office A-004"

#### Function keys:

- 1. Back one menu level higher
- 2. Further configure selected counting form

#### 5.5.1 Simple Cable Label

In this setting, a name of a test consists of 3 components:

Link - <Fixed counter with 3 digits>.

All tests are saved according to the following pattern.

Link-001

Link-002

Link-003

Link-004

etc.

#### 5.5.2 Free Form



In this counting scheme, a fixed component of the name can be selected, followed by a "-" and a 3-digit consecutive counter.

Enter the fixed part of the name in the first field. In the 2nd field, enter the first variable component.

#### 5.5.3 None

In this mode, no counting scheme is specified. The tester requests a name for the current test series before each jump to the Autotest menu.

#### 5.6 Profiles



The upper area of the screen shows the available profiles. The device is equipped with some default profiles ex works. The lower area of the screen shows the most important settings and parameters of the selected profile

#### Function keys:


- 1. return to the Home screen.
- 2. create another profile.
- 3. edit a profile.
- 4. delete a profile
- 5. activate a selected profile

#### Remark:

You can only edit or delete profiles as long as no autotest has been performed with this profile.

As soon as an autotest has been performed, the associated profile is locked.

#### 5.6.1 Create new profile



- Enter the desired name of the new profile at "Profile Name", e.g. "MY NETWORK TEST".
- At "Mode", select whether you want to create a profile for a network test or a cabling test.
- Select the desired interface at "Media".

Note: For LinkXpert TP only the copper interface is available.

In the lower part of the screen you can select and deselect certain tests.

Please note, the selection option depends on the mode and media.

## 5.7 Autotest - passive wiring



In the wiring test module, the device displays the wiring diagram with lengths.

#### Function keys:

- 1. Return to main screen
- 2. List of tests in this SITE.
- 3. Run this test again under the same test name. The existing results will be discarded.
- 4. Perform a new test with a new test name.

### 5.8 Autotest - Ethernet Tests



Autotests in network mode list all tests of the linked profile 23

The listed single tests are executed one after the other. The test time of an autotest depends strongly on the individual tests and can take up to several minutes. Do not disconnect from the network during the test so that the final result of the test is not affected.


Tests are automatically saved at the end of the autotest. By clicking on a single test, the results of a single test are listed.

#### Function keys:

- 1. Back to the main screen
- 2. List of tests in this SITE.
- 3. Run this test again under the same test name. The existing results will be discarded.
- 4. Perform a new test with a new test name.

## 5.9 Tools



The Tools menu is divided into 2 sections.

In the upper area of the screen, you will find the file manager and global WLAN and system settings.

In the lower area you can start single tests for copper networks, and for LinkXpert M3 fiber and WLAN networks.

- Click on to access the individual tests for copper networks.
- Click on —\*— to enter the single testsfor fiber optic networks .(M3)
- Click on to access the individual tests for WLAN aser networks .(M3)





#### 5.9.2 Generate reports and copy to USB

As soon as a connected USB memory is detected, the file manager shows 2 file areas.

The upper area shows the internal memory of the LinkXpert.

The lower area shows the contents of the external USB memory.



In the file manager you can filter for different file formats, delete or rename files.

The following filters are available.

- TST: compresses measurement results
- PDF: Test reports in PDF format
- CSV: test reports in CSV format
- XML: test reports in XML format

Using the button \_\_\_\_\_\_ you can copy selected files to the connected USB memory.

#### Function keys:

- 1. Back one menu level higher
- 2. Delete selected file
- 3. Rename selected file
- 4. Copy selected files from the USB memory to the device.

1. Once deleted files can not be restored.

- 2. Note that when renaming files, the file extension must NOT be changed, otherwise the changed file will NOT be listed anymore, as the file filters will hide this file.
- 3. When copying files from external USB memory to the device, no version or compatibility check is performed. If you copy test files of an older software version to the device, the device may malfunction.

#### 5.9.3 WLAN Global configuration

In the WLAN settings you can view the list of available access points and connect to an access point.





- 1. The WLAN functions of the LinkXpert M3 are only available if a compatible USB WLAN module is plugged into the USB socket.
- 2. General system settings of the WLAN interface like DHCP and VLAN can be found in the system settings under <a href="network">network</a>
- 3. The WLAN settings are global settings
- 1. CAUTION for networks consisting of multiple access points!

  Unlike conventional smartphones or laptops, LinkXpert connects to one physical access point, i.e. to one of the network's BSSIDs. It will NOT automatically jump to another BSSID if the physical hardware becomes unreachable.

The reason for this is that LinkXpert puts more focus on testing a physical access point than on the general connection to a network.

#### 5.9.3.1 WLAN access point selection (M3)

In the upper part of the screen you will see the list of visible access points.

> In the lower part of the screen you can see the details of a selected access point.

After LinkXpert has connected, the name of the access point and the assigned IP address will appear.

With Disconnect\_Wifi LinkXpert disconnects from the current access point.

If Auto Reconnect is selected, LinkXpert will automatically reconnect to the current access point.

If <%Enable**VNC%>** is selected, LinkXpert's screen can be played back on external devices using a commercially available VNC viewer.

1. If LinkXpert cannot connect to the selected access point, the menu will be left without connection!

#### 5.9.4 System settings

The system settings of the LinkXpert are globally effective and independent of test profiles, only the desired Ethernet speed and DHCP setting can be overridden by a profile.

#### 5.9.4.1 Time

The following settings can be made:

- 1. Date and time
- 2. Date and time formats


#### 5.9.4.2 Energy

The following settings can be made:

- 1. Screen brightness
- 2. Auto power off time
- 3. Standby time

The device turns off the screen during standby. Standby is ended by touching the screen or pressing the On/Off key.



#### 5.9.4.4 Network



The network settings of LinkXpert are global settings and are independent of the test profile used.

Settings are made separately for each interface.

"**Link Speed**" (copper only) allows the selection of the used Ethernet speeds.

**"DHCP & VLAN**" allows the configurations for DHCP and the used VLAN

#### 5.9.4.5 MAC settings

MAC addresses (Media Access Control Address, also Media Access Code) are unique addresses of a device connected to Ethernet.

The copper interface and fiber interface (M3) share a MAC address.

The WLAN interface (M3) has its own MAC address



- "Default
- "Custom

Function keys:

- 1. Back one menu level higher.
- 2. Apply selected settings.

Every regular Ethernet-enabled device has at least one unique, unchangeable MAC address.

With LinkXpert M3, the MAC addresses of the copper/fiber and WLAN interfaces can be changed to allow LinkXpert to connect to networks that only allow certain MAC addresses (socalled MAC whitelists).

The use of a foreign MAC address should only be done by specialists who are familiar with this topic and know the consequences for the network under investigation.


It is strongly recommended to leave the MAC address settings on "Default", if you do not have the necessary knowledge about MAC addresses and the network to be examined!

Incorrect MAC address configurations can lead to serious network errors such as data loss or device malfunctions.

#### 5.9.4.8 Firmware Update


- 1. Save all test data of the device before the firmware update, as they will be deleted by the firmware update!
- 2. Test data deleted by the firmware update cannot be restored.
- 3. Softing assumes no liability for the loss of test data.

# **Operation**



To upgrade the firmware of the device, perform the following steps:

- Connect the LinkXpert to the supplied power supply.
   IMPORTANT: Do NOT disconnect the power supply during the upgrade!
- 2. Copy the new firmware version to a USB memory stick and insert the memory stick into the USB slot of the device. The file name should have the following format Linkxpert\_fw\_version.tar.gz
- 3. Click Tools in the main menu
- 4. Click on "Firmware Upgrade"
- 5. Click on "Select File"



The upper area of the screen now shows the system memory of the LinkXpert, the lower area shows the memory content of the USB stick.

- 1. Select the upgrade file in the lower area of the screen.
- 2. Click on "Open

The upgrade will take several minutes. Do NOT disconnect the device from the power supply and do NOT restart the device manually.

After the upgrade, the device will reboot and display the main screen.



Do not disconnect the device from the power supply during the upgrade and do not restart the device manually as this may cause damage to the device.

### 5.9.4.9 Factory settings

If the factory setting is selected, the following actions are performed:

- 1. All custom profiles will be deleted.
- 2. All "Sites
- 3. All test reports are deleted.
- 4. The factory settings are restored.

The deletion of data on the device cannot be undone. Back up your data before resetting the device to factory settings.



# 6.1 All media (copper, fiber (M3), WLAN (M3))

### 6.1.1 Link-LED




To identify the link LED on the switch, LinkXpert can flash the link LED of the switch port. To do this, LinkXpert must be connected to a switch via the copper or fiber interface.

This test is only available in Tools mode.

### Function keys:

- 1. Back one menu level higher
- Change settings
   Make link LED flash for 10MBit/s
   Link LED for 100MBit/s flashing
   Make Link LED blink for 1GBit/s
- 3. Trigger test

### 6.1.2 Link Status



### **Link Status**

Please note:

- 1. For copper and fiber networks, the Link LED will also light up when connected to the network.

- 2. For WLAN networks, the connection is only indicated by the WLAN icon in the status bar.

### 6.1.3 DHCP Test



In the **DHCP Test**, LinkXpert checks whether the device can be assigned an IP address by the network and whether other information such as DNS server address and address range is transmitted.

The table shows the ping targets and the ping's sent (TX) and received (RX) replies.

Prerequisite is that the device can connect to the network and has a valid IP address, see also <u>Link Status</u> 40, <u>Network</u> 34, <u>DHCP</u> 41 for all media and <u>WLAN Global Configuration</u> 29

### 6.1.5 Duplicate IP



In the **Duplicate IP** test, LinkXpert scans the network for devices on the network that use the same IP address.

The table shows a list of devices on the network that have the same IP address.

It is required that the device can connect to the network and has a valid IP address, see also <u>Link Status</u> 40, <u>Network</u> 34, <u>DHCP</u> 41 for all media and <u>WLAN Global Configuration</u> 29

Function keys: (Tools module only)

- 1. Back one menu level higher
- 2. Start test

The device can search for IP address duplicates passively and actively.

In passive mode, the device only monitors the data stream and reports when IP duplicates are found.

In active mode, the device searches for duplicate IP addresses in the network.

The settings for this are made in the menu Network Discovery 4.

### 6.1.6 Traceroute



In the **Traceroute** test, LinkXpert shows intermediate stations that IP packets pass through until they arrive at a defined destination.

The table shows a list of intermediate stations (hops) with the corresponding time delays and the address of the intermediate station.

Prerequisite is that the device can connect to the network and has a valid IP address, see also <u>Link Status</u> 40, <u>Network</u> 34, <u>DHCP</u> 41 for all media and <u>WLAN Global Configuration</u> 29

Function keys: (Tools module only)

- 1. Back one menu level higher
- 2. Select destination address. The destination address can be a URL or an IP address.
- 3. Start new test

### 6.1.7 Network Discovery



In the **Network Discovery** test, LinkXpert lists all network nodes visible in the specified search range.

The table shows the MAC and IP address of the nodes with associated station name.

Prerequisite is that the device can connect to the network and has a valid IP address, see also <u>Link Status</u> 40, <u>Network</u> 34, <u>DHCP</u> 41 for all media and <u>WLAN Global Configuration</u> 29

Function keys: (Tools module only)

- 1. Back one menu level higher
- 2. Settings
  - IPV4 or IPV6
  - Listen" or "Scan" mode

The device can passively "listen" on the network or actively scan for devices.

The advantage of the passive mode is that LinkXpert itself does not send IP packets, the disadvantage of the passive mode is that devices may be found late or not at all.

In active mode LinkXpert communicates with the network and finds devices faster.

In the **CDP** test LinkXpert lists CDP responses of the connected switch.

CDP is the "Cisco Discovery Protocol", according to which compatible switches send out information about the switch port used and the switch itself at regular intervals.

The prerequisite is that the device can connect to the network and has a valid IP address, see also <u>Link Status</u> 40, <u>Network</u> 34, <u>DHCP</u> 41 for all media and <u>WLAN Global Configuration</u>

### 6.1.9 LLDP



In the **LLDP** test LinkXpert lists LLDP responses of the connected switch.


LLDP is the "Link Layer Discovery Protocol", according to which compatible switches send out information about the switch port used and the switch itself at regular intervals.

The content and frequency of this information depends on the configuration of the switch.

Prerequisite is that the device can connect to the network and has a valid IP address, see also <u>Link Status</u> 40, <u>Network</u> 34, <u>DHCP</u> 41 for all media and <u>WLAN Global Configuration</u> 29



## 6.2 Copper media

The following tests are available for copper media. Note: PoE is only available for twisted pair cabling.

### 6.2.1 Wiring diagram



The wiring diagram is given per pin, the length per pair. The shortest length is shown in the report as link length.

With **Set Reference** the reference plane for the length measurement can be set.


If the first patch cable is to be included in the length calculation, **Set Reference** should be performed WITHOUT the patch cable. If the first patch cable is not to be included in the length calculation, the cable must be connected at **Set Reference**.

  - a. color scheme of the wiring diagram
  - b. 2 or 4 pair measurement
  - c. Use of crossed cables

### 6.2.2 Tone Generator

This function is only available in the Tools menu.



The built-in tone generator is compatible with analog cable locators such as Softing CP15. This menu is only accessible in the Tools module.

You can send the search tone either on single or all pairs.

### 6.2.3 PoE Test



The **PoE Test** tests the ability of network switches to provide remote power according to IEEE802.3.

Depending on the test settings, PoE mode, polarity, type, power class and the minimum and maximum voltage applied at load are tested.

Function keys: (Tools module only)

- 1. Back one menu level higher
- 2. Change settings

Mode **AUTO**: automatically detect highest PoE class and perform PoE test.

Mode Manual : select a special **PoE Test** and perform **PoE Test**.

Mode **Quick Auto**: Select multiple PoE classes and perform **PoE Test**.

3. Start new test

# 6.3 Fiber optic media (M3)

The following tests are only available for fiber media.

### 6.3.1 VFL Visual Error Locator

This function is only available in the Tools menu.



In the **VFL**, the red light source of the LinkXpert M3 will be activated.

The red light source can be used for fiber tracking and port detection on fiber optic links.

The VFL port is compatible with all common fiber optic connectors with 2.5mm universal ferrule, such as SC and FC and ST connectors.

For fiber optic connectors with 1.25mm ferrule, such as LC connectors, Softing recommends the use of either adapter cables from 2.5mm to 1.25mm, e.g. SC to LC cable, or the use of an adapter #226542.

### Function keys:

- 1. Back one menu level higher
- 2. Switch red light source ON/OFF

1. The red light source is a class I laser source with a power <1mW.


# Do not look directly into the laser light with unprotected eyes, as this may cause non-healable injuries to the eye!

2. There is a physical contact between the red light source and the connector of the optical fiber section. Make sure to clean the connector end surface of the fiber optic cable before and after using the VFL function.



### 6.3.2 TX / RX

This function is only available in the Tools menu.



In the **TX/RX** the transmit (TX for Transmit) and receive values (RX for Receive) of the SFP module as well as information about the SFP module are read out.

The transmit and receive values are output in mW and can be used to diagnose SFP modules and fiber optic links.

### Function keys:

- 1. Back one menu level higher
- 2. Start test

- 1. Not all SFP modules output their TX and RX values.
- 2. To read out the TX and RX values Softing recommends to use the SFP modules offered by Softing.

### 6.3.3 Microscope

This function is only available in the Tools menu.



**Function keys** 

In the **microscope t**est the surface of fiber optic connectors and issue a good / bad statement according to IEC standard.

Connect the Softing fiber optic microscope #226539 to the USB port of the LinkXpert M3.

The fiber optic microscope has the following controls:

- 1. Large button: Switch between 200 and 400x magnification.
- 2. Small button: capture a connector image for end face inspection.
- 3. Control dial: image sharpness.

The upper screen area shows the image of the video microscope as a live image.

With the **Pause key** the live image can be paused, if "**Clear result** 

Below the live image, a bar graph is shown, which displays the current sharpness level of the live image in color and in %.

Note that you can only perform a connector check if the bar graph shows green. No check is possible when the bar graph is yellow or red.

Adjust the image sharpness with the setting wheel of the microscope until you see a clearly sharp image and green bar. The aim is to set the image sharpness close to 100%.

Function keys:

- 1. Back one menu level up.
- 2. Settings:
  - a. Selection of the test standard.
     Note that multimode, singlemode UPC and singlemode
     APC mating faces are subject to different test standards.
  - b. Auto Center:
    - If "Auto Center" is selected, LinkXpert M3 will try to always center the connector center on the image. It is recommended to leave this setting "On" for normal applications.
  - c. Capture button (See 2. at Microscope above):
    - "Freeze" onlyfreezes the live image.
    - "Freezeand Record
  - d. Magnification:
    - "High" selects 400x magnification, "Low
  - e. Overlay:

With "**On**" the borders of the 4 zone evaluation are displayed, with "**Off** 


- 3. Perform connector check. This function is equivalent to pressing the small key on the microscope.
- 4. Save inspection result
- 1. Use a compatible fiber optic microscope # 226539 from Softing. Microscopes from other manufacturers are not compatible.

The fiber optic microscope is an optional accessory.

## 6.4 WLAN Media (M3)

The following tests are only available for WLAN media.

### 6.4.1 WiFi Scan



In the **WiFi Scan** test, LinkXpert M3 scans the 2.4 and 5 GHz bands for access points and lists the access points.

Note that the included WiFi USB stick #226586 must be used for this. The USB stick is compatible with 802.11 ac, a, b, q, n.

Function keys (Tools mode only):

- 1. Back one menu level higher
- 2. Start test

### Question

The unit loses date and time settings

### **Answer**

The date and time are buffered internally by a separate battery. If the unit is not used for too long, the internal battery may be discharged. Connect LinkXpert to a charger to charge the buffer battery. Make sure that LinkXpert remains switched on while charging.
